The Japanese Doll Festival, or Girls' Day, is held on March 3, the third day of the third month. Bodhi Seals Now Available in the Bookstore!

If you are a new Sanga member, or not familiar with the Bodhi Seals, the Buddhist Churches of America (BCA) creates a new Bodhi-Enlightenment stamp each year as a way for members to support their temples and the BCA. They are generally sold 2 sheets for \$8.00, with half the proceeds going to the temple and the other half going to the BCA. The National Headquarters for the BCA in San Francisco included the quote in their letter about Bodhi Seals this year, "A single

Seal may seem insignificant, yet a wide usage of the Bodhi Seals by the Sanga will help others to become aware of the Buddha Dharma in America." Members are encouraged therefore, "to use the Seals on all correspondence stationary throughout the year as an expression of the ideal of the Nembutsu".

Last month a group from the temple attended the Northwest Buddhist Convention in Portland, Oregon. In the days leading up to the convention, I was thinking about the experiment from last month's newsletter. The experiment suggested keeping track of everything you throw away for one day. Even though Portland has a good reputation as a very environmentally friendly city, I imagined that a hotel and travel situation would provide a good example for a worse-case-scenario. It seems like there are always a lot of disposable containers and single use items provided at a hotel or at conventions that would generate a lot of garbage in just a couple of days.

I have to say that I was pleasantly surprised. One of the themes of the convention was "Buddhism in an Interdependent World". The Portland temple and convention organizers had chosen the Red Lion Hotel with the best green practices and the result was very impressive. The hotel itself has an extensive recycling and composting program. It was almost impossible to find a regular garbage can or anything to put in one. In the rooms and lobby there were recycling containers for all types of paper, plastic, glass, and cans. There were also composting containers in the lobby for food waste. The restaurants in the hotel also composted all of their food waste.

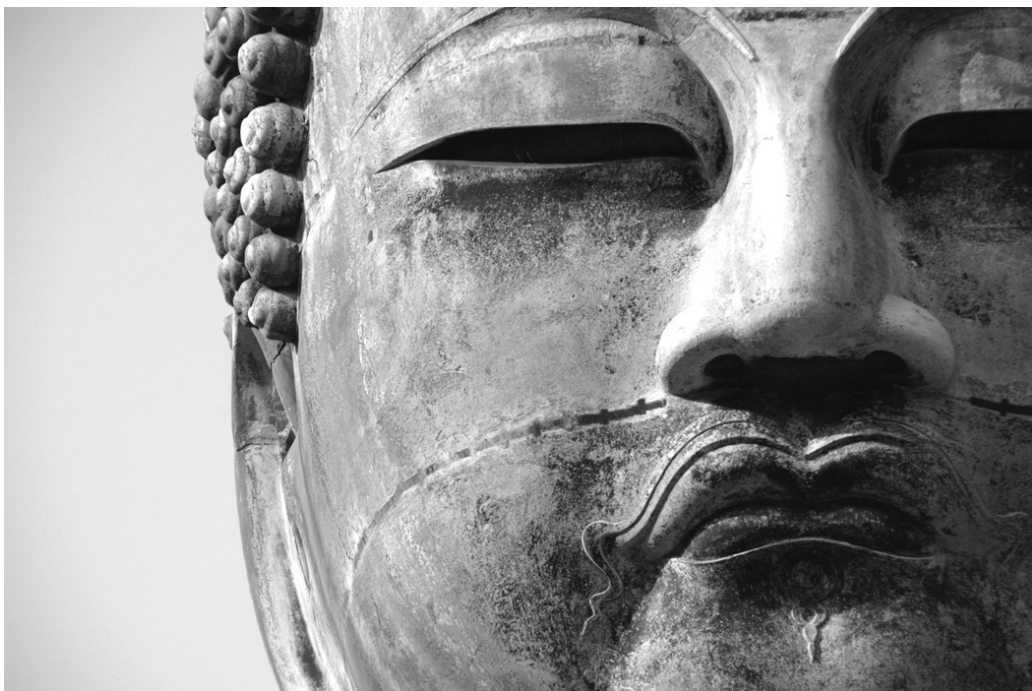
